## About the Artist

Esther Park was born in South Korea and started playing the piano at the age of four. She performed as a soloist with the Santa Ana Symphony Orchestra in 1994 and Downey Symphony Orchestra in 1996. Park received her Bachelor of Music degree in piano performance at the University of Southern California, and pursued a Master of Music degree in piano performance at University of California in Los Angeles. Esther has also attended the Aspen Music Festival, the Chautauqua Music Festival, the Brevard Music festival and the France International Piano Festival for her further studies. Park has accompanied for many choirs including the Hosanna Ladies Ensemble, the Korean Christian Chamber Choir and several different church choirs. She currently works as a staff pianist at Vanguard University, an organist and director of the Hand Bell Choir at Geneva Presbyterian Church in Laguna Woods, and an organist for the Windsong Southland Chorale.

She also received the Eleanor B. Daugherty Scholarship, the Chautauqua General Prize, the Estates of Mrs. Robert W Dobbins Scholarship, the Mary K Scott Memorial Endowment Fund, the Robert M. Wood Faith in American Youth Fund, and the Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin Allen Parsons Scholarship.
