THE IMPORTANCE OF PASSING THE **REGISTRATION PAD**

Every Sunday, we ask the congregation to pass and complete the brown registration pad found in the pew pocket. It seems like a mundane exercise, but we thought we'd share with you why it's important.

- The PC(USA) requires us to provide worship attendance statistics annually. This is the means by which we obtain these figures.
- It allows Session to discover and follow up with new guests, if they request it.
- It allows you to know who is sitting in the pew with you. Greet your neighbor by name!
- If we discover an absence from a regular worship attender, we are able to reach out and provide additional care when needed.

Basically, pew pads are a relationship building tool as well as a means for us to track attendance. So,

> even if the pastor forgets to remind us, don't forget to pass the pad!
